**Post Procedure Instructions for Type 2 diabetic patients following IV contrast**

After your exam in the Diagnostic Imaging department today you may resume your regular diet. It is necessary that the contrast be expelled from your body. You may wish to increase your fluid intake.


You must withhold your oral hypoglycemic medication for 48 hours post procedure. It will be necessary for you to come back to the hospital in 48 hours to have your BUN and Creatinine levels checked. The levels need to be reviewed before you start taking your oral hypoglycemic (glugophage, metformin). During normal clinic hours the referring clinic and physician will be responsible for obtaining this test. However, if your 48 hour period falls while the clinics are closed you should go to the Emergency Room and have them page the Radiologist on-call.
