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## **Mammography Services**

Purpose: To define the service provided by the Breast Imaging section of the Radiology Department.

Description: Mammography services will be performed to aid physicians and patients in the early detection of breast disease.

- 1. The ordering provider is designated as the responsible party for the care of the patient being referred for mammography services.
- 2. Written results of mammographic examinations will be reported to the ordering provider and patient as required by law.
- 3. The interpreting physician is available to offer guidance to the referring/ordering provider regarding which imaging methods will yield the maximum amount of diagnostic information.

## **Patient Selection Criteria**

Mammographic x-rays shall only be performed on patients who meet the age requirements recommended by the American Cancer Society, or on those whose clinical findings indicate the necessity of a mammographic evaluation.

- 1. Screening mammography services will be performed on asymptomatic patients who are at least 40 years of age
- 2. Screening exams are performed on younger patients with a family history that puts them in a high risk for developing breast cancer or depending on approval of the Radiologist.
- 3. Diagnostic mammograms will be performed to aid physicians and symptomatic patients in the diagnosis of breast disease.
- 4. Diagnostic mammograms will not be performed on pregnant women or women younger than 35 years of age unless there is proven medical necessity.
- 5. Diagnostic mammograms will be performed with physician's orders on patients whose history, signs, symptoms, clinical findings and previous mammogram results indicate the need for a mammogram.

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## **Scheduling Mammography Patients**

In order to provide optimal access to mammography services and sufficient time to obtain quality mammographic images, patients will be scheduled in intervals appropriate to the exam to be performed.

- 1. Schedulers should inquire about the patient's age to determine whether the patient meets the appropriate criteria. If a patient does not meet the criteria, the scheduler will consult the radiologist before scheduling the exam.
- 2. Patient demographic and referring physician information shall be obtained.
- 3. Schedulers shall obtain information that will allow them to determine whether the patient should be scheduled for a screening (asymptomatic), or diagnostic mammogram (symptomatic).
- 4. Screening mammograms will be scheduled in 15-minute time intervals, and diagnostic mammograms will be scheduled in 30-minute time intervals.
- 5. An attempt will be made to avoid scheduling mammograms one week before menstruation.
- 6. All scheduling will be processed in the EPIC.
